No. SO (Envt)/FE&WD/1-29/2021/Vol-II. In exercise of the powers conferred by section 31 of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Environmental Protection Act, 2014 (Act No. XXXVIII of 2014) read with section 13 thereof, the Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa is pleased to make the following rules, namely:

**THE KHYBER PAKHTUNKHWA ENVIRONMENTAL
ASSESSMENT RULES, 2021.**

1. Short title and commencement.---(1) These rules shall be called the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Environmental Assessment Rules, 2021.

(2) They shall come into force at once.

2. Definitions.---- (1) In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context;

- (a) **“Act”** means the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Environmental Protection Act, 2014 (Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Act No. XXXVIII of 2014);
- (b) **“Director-General”** means the Director-General of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Environmental Protection Agency;
- (c) **“Environmental Assessment Advisory Committee”** means the Committee constituted under rule 23 of these rules;
- (d) **“EIA”** means an Environmental Impact Assessment as defined in clause (s) of section 2 of the Act;
- (e) **“GEA”** means as General Environmental Approval to be submitted with the Agency by proponent, which are not covered by Environmental Impact Assessment or Initial Environmental Examination;
- (f) **“GIS”** means Geographic Information System;
- (g) **“GPS”** means Global Positioning System;
- (h) **“IEE”** means an Initial Environmental Examination as defined in clause (ff) of section 2 of the Act; and
- (i) **“Schedule”** means a Schedule appended to these rules.

(2) Words and expressions used in these rules but not defined shall have the same meanings as are assigned to them in the Act.

3. Application for screening and scoping of project.--- The proponent shall file an application with the Agency, having project description or activities on attached proforma as specified in **Schedule-I** to get clear directives for screening and scoping of the project, as per rule 4.

4. Projects requiring an EIA or IEE or GEA.---Where the project falls with the categories mentioned in **Schedules-II, III and IV**, the proponent shall file EIA or IEE or GEA respectively, with the Agency.

5. Directions for a specific project.---Where the project does not fall within the categories as mentioned in **Schedule-II, III and IV** and the Agency is of the opinion that said project may create an environmental hazard, the Agency shall direct the proponent to file an EIA, IEE or GEA, as the case may be, for reasons to be recorded in such directions:

Provided that such directions shall not be issued without the recommendations in writing of the Environmental Assessment Advisory Committee.

6. Preparation of guidelines for EIA, IEE and GEA.--- Guidelines for preparation of EIA or IEE or GEA of general and sectoral applicability may be specified by the Agency; provided that such guidelines may indicate specific assessment requirements for planning, construction and operation of a project relating to a particular sector.

7. Review Fees.---The proponent shall pay, at the time of submission of an EIA or IEE or GEA, a non-refundable review fee to the specified account of the Agency, as per rates given in **Schedule-V**.

8. Filing of EIA, IEE and GEA.--- (1) The proponent shall file ten paper copies and two electronic copies of an EIA or IEE with the Agency.

(2) Every EIA or IEE shall be accompanied by–

- (a) an application, in the form set out in **Schedule-VI**; and
- (b) original receipt of the review fee slip.

(3) The process for filing the GEA shall be the same as mentioned in sub-rule (1) and (2) except one hard and electronic copy of the report shall be submitted with the Agency.

9. Preliminary scrutiny.---(1) Within ten (10) working days of filing of the EIA, IEE or GEA, the Agency shall,-

- (a) confirm that the EIA, IEE or GEA is complete for purposes of initiation of the review process and issue confirmation letter to the proponent; or
- (b) require the proponent to submit such additional information as may be specified at any stage during the review process; or

- (c) return the EIA, IEE or GEA to the proponent for revision, clearly listing the points requiring further study and discussion.

(2) Nothing in sub-rule (1) shall prohibit the Agency from requiring the proponent to submit additional information at any stage the review process.

10. Review.--- (1) The Agency shall carry out review of the GEA within thirty (30) days, IEE within forty-five (45) days, and of the EIA within ninety (90) days, of issuance of confirmation of completeness under rule 9.

(2) In order to review the EIA or IEE, the Director General shall constitute a review committee consists of such members as determined by the Director General on the recommendations of the concerned Directorate authorized by the Director General in his behalf.

(3) In reviewing the EIA or IEE, the Agency shall consult review committee and may also solicit views of the Environmental Assessment Advisory Committee.

(4) The Director General may, where considers necessary, constitute a committee or team, to inspect the site of the project and submit its report on such matters as may be specified.

(5) The review of the EIA or IEE by the Agency shall be based on quantitative and of qualitative assessment of the documents and data furnished by the proponent, comments received from the public and Government Agencies where applicable, and views of the committees mentioned in sub-rules(2) and (4) above.

(6) The review of GEA shall be based on the guidelines issued by the Agency.

(7) The Agency may call the proponent for discussion or presentation.

11. Public participation.--- (1) In the case of an EIA, the Agency shall, with the previous information to district administration or local police, simultaneously with the issuance of confirmation of completeness, cause to be published in any (English or Urdu) national newspaper and in a local newspaper of general circulation in the area affected by the project, a public notice mentioning the type of project, its exact location, the name and address of the proponent and the place at which the EIA of the project can, subject to the restrictions, be accessed. The expenditure of the advertisement and arrangements for the public hearing shall be borne by the proponent.

(2) The notice, issued under sub-rule (1), shall fix a date, time and place for public hearing of any comments on the project or its EIA.

(3) The date fixed under sub-rule (2), shall not be earlier than fifteen (15) days from the date of publication of the notice.

(4) The Agency shall also ensure the circulation of one hundred and fifty (150) copies of executive summary in Urdu to the concerned Government Agencies or stakeholders to solicit their comments thereon.

(5) All comments received by the Agency from the public or any Government Agency or stakeholders shall be collated, tabulated and duly considered by it before decision on the EIA.

(6) The Agency may issue guidelines indicating the basic techniques and measures to be adopted to ensure effective public consultation, involvement and participation in EIA.

(7) Public hearing of Environmental Assessment, if reported upon by the District Administration or local police that it may cause law and order situation, the same may be postponed or delayed to alternate site or to be held in the premises of District Administration with the reasons be recorded by the Agency.

(8) The proponent shall record a video of the public hearing and shall submit two (02) copies of the recordings to the Agency.

12. Site selection.--- Notwithstanding anything contained in any other law or rules for the time being in force, no site shall be utilized for the project unless the environmental approval, as required under sub-section (1) of section 13 of the Act, is obtained by the proponent from the Agency.

13. Decision.--- (1) On completion of the review, the decision of the Agency shall be communicated to the proponent in the form specified in **Schedule-VII**, in the case of an EIA or in the form specified in **Schedule-VIII** in the case of an IEE or in case of GEA in the form specified in **Schedule-IX**. The conditions in the decisions as communicated by the Agency shall be binding upon the proponent.

(2) On the basis of sufficient grounds to be recorded, the Agency while communicating the forms as specified in sub-rule (1), where consider necessary shall also ask the proponent to submit IEE for a project which was reviewed under GEA category and an EIA for a project which was reviewed under IEE category.

14. Conditions of Approval.--- (1) Every approval of an EIA or IEE or GEA shall, in addition to such conditions as may be imposed by the Agency, be subject to the conditions that the project shall be designed and constructed, and mitigation and other measures adopted, strictly in accordance with the EIA or IEE or GEA unless any variations thereto have been specified in the approval by the Agency.

(2) Where the Agency accords its approval subject to certain conditions, the proponent shall, before commencing construction of the project, acknowledge acceptance of the stipulated conditions by executing an undertaking in the form specified in **Schedule-X** on stamp paper.

15. Confirmation of compliance.---The proponent shall, before commencing operation of the project, obtain from the Agency written confirmation that the conditions of approval, and the requirements in the EIA or IEE or GEA relating to design and construction, adoption of mitigation and other relevant measures, have been duly complied with.

(2) Where a request for confirmation of compliance is received from a proponent, the Agency shall carry out such inspection of the site and plant and

machinery and seek such additional information from the proponent as it may deem fit; provided that every effort shall be made by the Agency to provide the requisite confirmation or otherwise within thirty (30) days of receipt of the request, with complete information, from the proponent.

(3) The Agency shall, while issuing the requisite confirmation of compliance, impose such other conditions as additional mitigating measure, and the operation, maintenance and monitoring of the project as it may deem fit, and such conditions shall be deemed to be included in the conditions to which approval of the project is subject.

(4) The proponent shall apply for renewal of the operational approval after every three (03) years.

16. Deemed Approval.--- For the purpose of sub-section (4) of section 13 of the Act, the four-month period for communication of decision shall commence from the date of confirmation of completeness issued by the Agency under clause (a) of sub-rule (1) of rule 9 if the review period was not extended under rule 17:

Provided that nothing in this rule shall be applicable to cases, where the delay in granting approval has been occasioned by the proponent or any person acting on his behalf.

17. Extension in Review Period.--- Where the review period is extended under sub-section (5) of section 13 of the Act, Government shall, in consultation with the Agency, indicate the various steps of the review process to be taken during the extended period and the estimated time required for each step.

18. Validity Period of Approval.--- (1) The approval accorded by the Agency under section 13 of the Act, shall be valid, for commencement of construction for a period of two years from the date of issuance.

(2) If construction is commenced during the initial two years validity period, the validity of the approval shall stand extended for a further period of two years from the date of issue.

(3) After issuance of approval, if construction is not started within the stipulated time as stipulated by sub-rule (2), the proponent shall apply to the Agency in writing for extension in the validity period with reasons for such extension.

(4) If the proponent applies to the Agency for extension in the validity periods mentioned in sub-rule (1) and (2), the Director General may grant extension with reasons to be recorded for such period not exceeding two years at a time, if the conditions of the approval do not require significant changes:

Provided that the Agency may requires the proponent to submit afresh EIA or IEE or GEA, if in its opinion changes in location, design, construction and operation of the project so warrant.

19. Entry and Inspection.--- (1) For purposes of verification of any matter relating to the review or to the conditions of approval of an EIA or IEE or GEA prior to, during or after commencement of construction or operation of a project, duly authorized staff of the Agency shall be allowed without any hindrance to

enter and inspect the project site, factory building and plant and equipment installed therein.

(2) The proponent shall ensure full cooperation of the project staff at site to facilitate the inspection, and shall provide such information as may be required by the Agency for this purpose and pursuant thereto.

20. Monitoring.--- (1) After issuance of approval by the Agency, the proponent shall submit a report to the Agency on the completion of construction of the project.

(2) After issuance of confirmation of compliance, the proponent shall submit six months report summarizing operational performance of the project, with reference to the conditions of approval and maintenance and mitigatory measures adopted by the project to be verified by the Agency.

(3) To enable the Agency to effectively monitor compliance with the conditions of approval, the proponent shall furnish such additional information as the Agency may require.

21. Cancellation of approval.--- (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in these rules, if, at any time, on the basis of information or report received or inspection carried out, the Agency is of the opinion that the conditions of an approval have not been complied with, or that the information supplied by a proponent in the approved EIA or IEE or GEA is incorrect, it shall issue notice to the proponent to show cause, within two weeks of receipt thereof, why the approval should not be cancelled.

(2) If no reply is received or if the reply is considered unsatisfactory, the Agency may, after giving the proponent an opportunity of being heard:

- (i) require the proponent to take such measures and to comply with such conditions within such period as it may specify, failing which the approval shall stand cancelled; or
- (ii) cancel the approval.

(3) On cancellation of the approval, the proponent shall cease construction or operation of the project forthwith.

(4) Action taken under this rule, shall be in addition to any other action that may be taken against the proponent under the Act or rules or any other law for the time being in force.

22. Registers of IEE, EIA and GEA Projects.--- Separate Registers to be maintained by the Agency for EIA or IEE or GEA projects, shall be in the form specified in **Schedule-XI**.

23. Environmental Assessment Advisory Committee.--- (1) The Environmental Assessment Advisory Committee, to be established under sub-section (6) of section 5 of the Act, shall comprise of-

- (a) Director General of the Agency; Chairman
- (b) Director of the concerned Region of the Agency; Member
- (c) a representative of the Forestry, Environment and Wildlife Department, Member

not below the rank of BPS-18; and

(2) The Environmental Assessment Advisory Committee may co-opt any technical expert or representative of Government Agency or Non-Governmental Organization, possessing specialized knowledge in the relevant field.

(3) The Deputy Director EIA shall be the Secretary of each Environmental Assessment Advisory Committee.

(4) The Environmental Assessment Advisory Committee shall render advice to the Agency on all aspects of environmental assessment, including guidelines, procedures and categorization of projects.

24. Environmentally sensitive areas.--- (1) The Agency may, after approval of the Government under clause (xii) of section 7 of the Act, designate an area to be environmental sensitive area.

(2) Notwithstanding anything contained in rule 4, it shall be mandatory upon the proponent to file an EIA with the Agency where the project is in sensitive area as notified under sub-rule(1).

(3) The Agency may, from time to time, issue guidelines to assist proponents and other persons involved in the environmental assessment process to plan and prepare projects located in environmentally sensitive areas.

25. Repeal.--- The Pakistan Environmental Protection Agency Review of Initial Environmental Examination and Environmental Impact Assessment Regulations, 2000, are hereby repealed to the extent of the Province of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.

2. Chemical projects;
 - (a) Calcium Carbonate 5000 tons per annum and above;
 - (b) Sodium Silicate 2000 tons per annum and above;
 - (c) Color coated film 1000 tons per annum and above;
 - (d) Poly vinyl acetate 1000 tons per annum and above;
 - (e) Phenolic resins above 2000 tons per annum; and
 - (f) Sulfuric and other acids.
3. Fertilizer plants having capacity 30,000 tons annually.
4. Sugar mills and distillery.
5. Vegetable ghee and oil mills.
6. Soft drinks/beverages with annual production above 50million liters.
7. Industrial Estates (including export processing zones).
8. Pesticides manufacturing and formulation with total production of 500 tons per annum and above.
9. Petrochemical Complex.
10. Pyrolysis Units.
11. Paper Mills.
12. Glass Manufacturing Units.
13. Chip Boards Units/Medium Density Fiber Units.
14. Tanning and Leather Finishing Projects.
15. Steel mills and Furnaces.
16. Match Factory.
17. Cigarettes Manufacturing Factory.
18. Poultry Protein Production Units.
19. Plastic bags Manufacturing Units except secondary carrier bags.
20. Battery Manufacturing Plant.

C. Mining and mineral processing

1. Mining and Processing of coal, gold, copper and sulfur.
2. Mining, Processing major non-ferrous metals, iron and steel.
3. Commercial extraction/Mining of limestone other mineral having blasting activity.
4. Smelting plants.
5. Asphalt Plants (on permanent basis).

D. Transport

1. Airport.
2. Federal or Provincial Highways (Except maintenance, re-building or re-construction of existing metalled road).
3. Railway tracks.

E. Water Management, Dams and Irrigation

Dams and reservoirs with storage volume over 50 million cubic meters or surface area of 08 square kilometers and above.

F. Waste Disposal

1. Handling storage or disposal of hazardous or toxic wastes or radioactive waste including landfill sites, and combine incineration plant.
2. Waste disposal facilities for domestic or industrial wastes, with annual capacity of 10,000 tones and above.
3. Waste water treatment plant for domestic or industrial effluents with annual capacity of 10,000 cubic meters and above.

G. Urban Development and Tourism

1. Land use studies and urban plans (large cities).
2. Large-scale tourism development projects with total cost more than Rs.300 million.
3. Housing schemes with above 500 Kanal for plain area and above 200 Kanal for hilly areas.
4. Residential / commercial high rise buildings / apartments from 15 storeys and above.

H. Environmentally Sensitive Areas

All projects situated in environmentally sensitive areas.

I. Other projects

1. Any other project for which filing of an EIA is required by the Agency under rule 5 of these rules.
2. Any other project likely to cause an adverse environmental effect.

Categories of projects requiring Initial Environmental Examination (IEE)

A. Energy

1. Power generation 01-50 MW (hydropower and coal).
2. Thermal power generation 01-200 MW (other than coal).
3. Solar Projects having capacity more than 01 MW.
4. Transmission lines Less than 11 KV.
5. Oil and Gas pipe lines (6 inches and above dia) with length of 10-50 KM.
6. Seismic 2D/3D/Survey for Oil and Gas.
7. LPG and LNG storage.
8. Bulk Oil and Gas depot.
9. Waste to energy projects for commercial and industrial use.
10. Grid Stations.

B. Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries

1. Poultry Farms/control sheds having 15,000 sq.ft. and above covered area.
2. Fish Farms 01 Acre and above.

C. Manufacturing and processing

1. Chemicals Projects
 - (a) Calcium Carbonate below 5000 tons per annum.
 - (b) Sodium Silicate below 2000 tons per annum.
 - (c) Thinner 10,000 gallons per annum and above.
 - (d) Color coated film below 1000 tons per annum.
 - (e) Poly vinyl acetate below 1000 tons per annum.
 - (f) Phenolic resins 1000-2000 tons per annum.
 - (g) Chrome sulfate 10,000 tons per annum and above.
 - (h) Dyes manufacturing and processing.
 - (i) Sulfur black manufacturing and processing.
2. Ceramics Manufacturing Units.
3. Polyester/Viscose/polyfilament yarn.
4. Soft drinks/beverages with annual production 01-50millionliters.
5. Milk and milk based products having capacity 10,000 liters daily and above.
6. Pharmaceuticals.
7. Textile mills/ power looms/ weavings/ apparels/ acrylic/ yarn/ fiber weaving.
 - (a) Above 50 power looms;
 - (b) 15000 & above spindles; and
 - (c) Acrylic 1500 tons annually.
8. Rubber and plastic products manufacturing.
9. Paints/ varnishes factory Oil, Lubricants, Oil Reclamation, Grease and Allied Products.
10. Fruit and Vegetable Processing Units.
11. Tea packing / blending Units.
12. Steel re-rolling Mills.
13. Pesticides Manufacturing and Formulation.

14. Fertilizer Units.

D. Mining and mineral processing

1. Commercial extraction/river bed mining of clay, gravel, sand, limestone and other minerals.
2. Power Crushers/ Stone Crushers/ Crush plants/ Crush Machines.
3. Asphalt Plants (on temporary basis).

E. Transport

1. Roads/rails tunnel.
2. Dry port.

F. Water Management, Dams and Irrigation

Dams and reservoirs with storage volume 21- 50 million cubic meter or surface area less than 08 square kilometers.

G. Water supply

Water supply schemes (From river water to community's consumption).

H. Waste disposal

1. Waste disposal facility for domestic or industrial wastes, with annual capacity less than 10,000 tones.
2. Waste water treatment plant for domestic or industrial effluents with annual capacity less than 10,000 cubic meters.

I. Urban Development

1. Housing schemes with area 50-500 Kanal in plain area and 50-200 Kanal for hilly area.
2. New hospitals above 100 beds.
3. 07 to 14 Multi-storey buildings having residential and commercial setup on the total plot size more than 2000 square yards.

J. Other Projects

Any other project for which filing of an IEE is required by the Agency under rule5 of these rules.

Schedule-IV

Categories of Projects requiring General Environmental Approval (GEA)

A. Energy

1. Hydro/Coal Power less than 01 MW.
2. Thermal Power less than 01 MW (other than coal power).
3. Solar power plants from 500 KW up to 01 MW.
4. CNG, LPG, LNG (filling and re-fuelling stations) and Petrol pumps.
5. Oil and Gas pipeline (06 inches and above dia) below 10 Km.

B. Agriculture and Livestock

1. Agricultural projects involving repacking, mixing, formulation of Agricultural products.
2. Fertilizer grinding Unit, rock phosphate or other grinding of rock material.
3. Poultry Farms/control sheds having 1500-15,000 sq.ft. covered area.
4. Dairy Farm with 40 and above buffalos/cows.
5. Cattle Farm with 100 and above goats/sheeps.

C. Manufacturing and Processing

1. Fat Burning Units.
2. Cosmetic Industry.
3. Preservation and storage of animal skin.
4. Glue manufacturing.
5. Thinner below 10,000 gallons per annum.
6. Phenolic resins below 1000 tons per annum.
7. Poly Propylene mates/bags.
8. Soap and detergent Units.
9. Biscuits Factories.
10. Ice Factories.
11. Mineral water Units.
12. Cotton/Wool processing/cotton waste processing.
13. Paper boards.
14. Tobacco Kilns.
15. Block Factories.
16. Recycling Units (Paper, Plastic, Glass, Scrap, etc.).
17. Flour/Pulses/Rice Mills/Guar Gum Processing Mills.

D. Mining and Mineral Processing

Crushing, grinding of stone and separation processes/soapstone/
marble/chips/gypsum Units/limekilns/ brick kilns/coal grinding.

E. Water Management and Irrigation

1. New Irrigation canals/ channels with length of 10 Km and above (or) serving 15,000 hectares and above.
2. Dams/reservoir with storage volume 10-20 million cubic meters.

F. Waste Disposal

Hospital incinerators.

G. Telecommunication

BTS Towers.

H. Miscellaneous

1. Slaughter Houses.
2. Vehicle Service Stations.

I. Other Projects

Any other project for which filing of GEA is required by the Agency under rule 5 of these rules.
